### FRUIT

**Fruit is the most important food.** Did you know that fruits should be eaten on an empty stomach, or before your meals? **STRAWBERRY:** Protective Fruit. Strawberries have the highest total antioxidant power among major fruits & protects the body from cancer-causing, blood vessel-clogging free radicals.

**ORANGE:** Sweetest medicine. Eating 2-4 oranges a day may keep colds away, lower cholesterol, prevent & dissolve kidney stones as well as lessens the risk of colon cancer.

**WATERMELON:** Coolest thirst quencher. Composed of 92% water, it is also packed with a giant dose of glutathione, which helps boost our immune system. They are also a key source of lycopene - the cancer fighting oxidant. Other nutrients found in watermelon are Vitamin C & Potassium.

**GUAVA & PAPAYA:** Top awards for Vitamin C. They are the clear winners for their high Vitamin C content. Guava is also rich in fiber, which helps prevent constipation. Papaya is rich in carotene; this is good for your eyes.

**Drinking Cold Water after a meal = Cancer!** Can you believe this? For those who like to drink cold water, this article is applicable to you. It is nice to have a cup of cold drink after a meal. However, the cold water will solidify the oily stuff that you just consumed. It will slow down the digestion.
