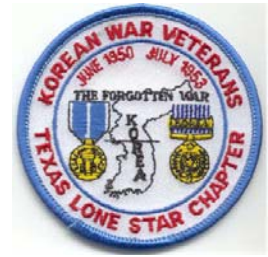

## OUR REVISIT TRIP TO KOREA

We are back from the Revisit Korea Program. We arrived Sunday, October 2nd, at 2 pm. It was a most enjoyable trip! A trip of a life time!

We got to meet a lot of veterans and their wives and/or children or grandchildren from the US, Hawaii, Thailand, and the Netherlands. Some of the veterans were from 76 to 86 yrs old. The Korean gov't has a special Ministry of Patriots and Veterans Affairs Office that was in charge of the Revisit Program. There must have been 5 buses full of veterans. They have been doing this since 1975. All the guides spoke good English. They had volunteer assistants that helped with wheelchair assistance and were available to help the veterans and their families in whatever was needed. They even had an ambulance follow the group buses everywhere we went in case we needed it. Which thankfully we did not.

It is a very modern place. They still have some old parts but the majority is quite modern with the latest electronic gadgetry. They have about 10 million people in Seoul. Most of them live in high rise ultra modern apartments. They call it the Manhattan of Korea. It reminded me a little of Mexico and NY.

They kept us busy Wed thru Sat. It felt like we had been there 2 wks for all the stuff they had us visit. But it was a very neat trip. They had a buffet for every meal. We tried a little of everything for the most part. But they had American food as well. We did good and thank God we did not get sick.

David became a celebrity when they took us to the War Memorial Museum. They were having a commemoration of the Liberation of Korea. They introduced the VIP's, some token veterans from the states, Netherlands, and other nations that helped them during the Korean War. Afterwards, we went to the Halls of Memoriam that has the names of the veterans that lost their lives during the war. They had them by countries and the U.S. by States. David wanted to take a tracing of his brother's name but did not want to be disrespectful by climbing up on a stone to reach Frank's name. The VIP Congresswoman, Song Young-sun, came by and said she was giving him permission to step up and even had one of her aides give him a piece of paper. Then all these photographers and TV news guys started taking their pictures. The TV or newspaper guy even interviewed David about his brother. I think he may even have come out in their news. The Congresswoman said she was going to put their photo in her newsletter. Only the Lord!



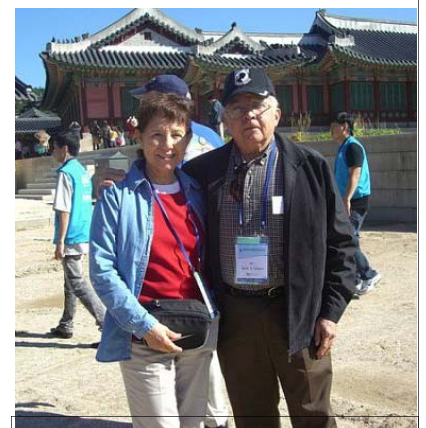

At the WELCOMING BANQUET, we were seated at the table with Navy Admiral Hong-Yull Kim. The veterans received Peace medals from the Korean Government for their service, and the Admiral presented David with a Peace Medal in honor of his brother Frank, who is still MIA.

They had a professional photographer follow us everywhere and they gave us a DVD with a movie and pictures of our trip. That was neat!

In the U.S. the Korean War is known as "The Forgotten War" but in Korea the people commemorate and remember the UN veterans and especially the U.S. veterans every year. They are very appreciative of their Freedom and the men that sacrificed their lives for them.

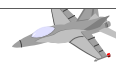

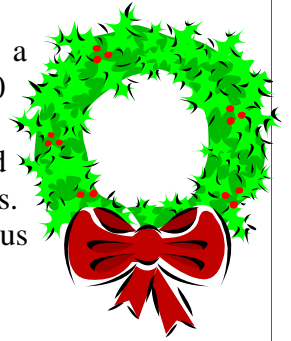
