ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE




The cutoff date for all orders is May 1. Bob will purchase the block of tickets in early May and distribute them at the May General Meeting.

'WARRIOR VOICES'

Author Barbara Derksen has had the opportunity to delve into a part of history that has been forgotten.

The book, "**Second to None - Warrior Voices**", came out this past summer and contains the stories of 54 soldiers who fought for their countries with the **Second Infantry Division of the Army**. Jim Warrender, Quimby, past president of the Second Infantry Division, asked the author to put a collection of the veteran's stories together.

"The Korean War has been labeled 'the forgotten war'", she commented. She intended to bring to the surface a minute fraction of the millions of stoies that could be shared.

Over about a two-year period, Derksen received stories - hundreds of stories - many provided by Warrender from veterans he is acquainted with. She narrowed the stories down to 54 for her book.


The TV news crew rushed in after capturing the event on film.

3. Where were you when you were injured?
4. What was the extent of your injury?
5. How were you transported to the MASH unit? How long did the transportation take?

7. What treatment did you receive at the MASH unit?
8. What is your most vivid memory of the MASH unit?
9. Where were you transferred after you were treated at the MASH unit?

We would appreciate any help you can give us.
