DEPARTMENT OF TEXAS MEETING

The 2007 KWVA Department of Texas Meeting was held this year in the State Capitol, Aug. 13th-14th. Department President, Marvin Dunn, led the meetings and one of the suggestions was that there be more communication between the Department and the Chapters, and also more communication between the Chapters. He asked that all Chapters submit a quarterly account of their activities. This does not have to be anything elaborate, just some notes in a letter or e-mail. He will edit them and publish a quarterly Department Newsletter. This will keep everyone informed about what is happening Statewide, and will also be a way of sharing ideas that others can adopt. He would like to begin this as of January 1, 2008.

During the morning executive council meeting, each of the Chapters talked about what they were doing in their areas. There were lots of good ideas that came from this meeting, from greeting Iraq veterans at the airports to cleaning up local, neglected cemeteries to creating Chapter Biography books with each member's picture and story. There was also the usual honor guard at funerals, parades and ceremonies and volunteer work at VA facilities. The Victoria Chapter is getting ready to dedicate their own Korean War Memorial. The El Paso Chapter has that was formerly administered by the Military Cemetery in their area, Fort there. It has since been transferred to the VA. They said it was costing \$75,000, annually to maintain the grounds, so they eliminated all the grass and replaced it with crushed stone. This makes it hard to walk on or push a wheelchair, plus it looks terrible for a cemetery, but the VA there wont budge. The chapter is asking all members to help by contacting their Congressmen, and ask assistance in correcting the problem.



KWVA National President Lou Dechert was in attendance, and he talked about the possibility of finally obtaining a National Charter. This would give us more status and credibility, but there is also a downside. Once the Charter is issued, we would be under the supervision of the Federal Government. Changing the By-laws, means going before a Congressional committee, for example. Also, the General Accounting Office will audit you regularly. Every Chapter would have to be in compliance with the National By-Laws, otherwise they would have to leave the organization. This would be the Government's doing, not the National. Chapters currently out of compliance should take steps now to remedy things beforehand.

The meeting was a great success.. It was held in the Crowne Plaza, which was a beautiful facility. The Banquet was held in the nearby Texas Land & Cattle Company restaurant and the Meal was excellent.

Overall, the meeting was very good.

SALUTING THE FLAG NEW GUIDANCE

*This bill has only been passed by the Senate and **has not** been passed by the House of Representatives*

The Senate has passed legislation to ensure that veterans and service members can salute the flag when not in uniform. The bill S1877, sponsored by Sen. James Inhofe [R-OK] would address the ambiguity of current law, which states that veterans and service members not in uniform should place their hand over their hearts, without specifying whether they can or should salute the flag. Inhofe said, "The salute is a form of honor and respect, representing pride in one's military service. Unfortunately, current U.S. law leaves confusion as to whether veterans and service members out of uniform can or should salute the flag." Inhofe said he believes this is "an appropriate way to honor and recognize the 25 million veterans who have served in the military and remain as role models to other citizens. Those who are currently serving or have served in the military have earned this right, and their recognition will be an inspiration to others." The House would have to agree to the legislation before it could become law. The bill does not address the ambiguity of veterans saluting during *The Pledge of Allegiance* and playing of the *National Anthem*. Present policy for saluting is:

When the flag passes in a procession, or when it is hoisted or lowered, all should face the flag and salute.

To salute, all persons come to attention.

Those in uniform give the appropriate formal salute.

Citizens not in uniform salute by placing their right hand over the heart and men with head cover should remove it and hold it to the left shoulder, hand over the heart.

Members of organizations in formation salute upon command of the person in charge.

The pledge of allegiance should be rendered by standing at attention, facing the flag and saluting.
